Tidworth through the Ages

nthony Pickernell is a local man with so much knowledge of our Tidworth's rich history it would be a shame not to share it with those who live here. So here is the first instalment compiled from the records of Mr Kenneth Pickernell, Anthony's Father. He will in each episode of Tidworth Through the Ages cover either the Military or Civilian activities and changes which occurred during this time.

<u>1914-1918</u>

he Armistice of November 11th 1918 brought the British Army – then a mighty fighting machine to a sudden halt.

The immediate feelings of the soldiers was not one of exaltation or vocal rapture, but one of dogtired weariness. But not for long rested restored and revitalised the single prospect above all else was to get home and get out of the Army.

In some parts of the country good order and military discipline suffered, owing to the delays imposed on them for the



In 1920 The War Department sold The Ram In North Tidworth to The Portsmouth United **Breweries** Ltd. The first famous Tidworth Searchlight Tattoo took place on the 8th 9^{th and} 10th June 1920 on the polo ground in

Demobilisation of the Army's millions of soldiers.

Tidworth saw none of the troubles that Demobilization gave rise to. The Southern Command Demobilization Centre was at Chiseldon dealing with thousands a day while Tidworth dealt with a mere few hundreds. Mr Williams the Tidworth Railway Booking Clerk recalls the hundreds and hundreds of free Railway Warrants that had to be dealt with at Tidworth Station, and the extra trains that had to be laid on to cope with all the departures.

Soldiers in numbers vanished quickly from Tidworth bringing unemployment or bad employment to many residents, trading in Station Road and other businesses in Tidworth suffered badly. This was to last but a short time when more regular troops began arriving in Tidworth, Cavalry and Infantry unit's once again occupied barracks in Tidworth.

Shops in Station Road 1918 Railway Station -

front of Tedworth House. The Tattoo was a great success and became a major event in Tidworth until 1939 when the international situation made it impossible to continue. It was another twenty seven years before another Tidworth Tattoo was produced.

The British Legion (Now the Royal British Legion) was established in 1921, Tidworth Branch was formed on 12th July 1922 a hutted club was erected between Station Road and Ordnance Road, This was replaced by the existing building which was opened by HRH The Duke of Gloucester on 27th October 1962.

Some of the first military houses to be provided exclusively for civilian employees were built in 1927 in Nuns Walk (Now Part of Sidbury Circular) and five years later additional houses were built in Nepal Road.

i I am Donna Burns and I am a presenter

and DJ at Castledown FM your local community Radio Station.

Weekday mornings are so much fun for me. I am super lucky to be doing something I thought I would never get the chance to do and be

a Presenter on a Radio Station. Castledown FM is our local community station which brings us local information, interviews and great music from a range of people and genres.

I was initially a guest on Kev Lawrence's Christmas Eve show along with my fellow La La's from the Tidworth Military Wives Choir back. In 2016 where we sang a live set and were interviewed. I absolutely loved it!

I was then brought back in to the station by my friend Kelly to help give my point of view on Loan Sharks in a special show that Castledown FM produced telling the stories of people who have had their lives turned upside down by non-regulated money lenders. It was at this moment I knew I wanted to be part of this amazing team of people.

Kelly invited me to join her on a Wednesday morning for her Hump Day Hooray Show, and I absolutely loved it. I have never laughed so much and knew this was just what I needed to help me with my mental health. Being an army wife and mum of 5 children can really affect your sense of identity. I was no longer just me and my priorities and goals in life had changed dramatically. My youngest child has asthma and was constantly in and out of hospital so I couldn't work. I could however volunteer at the Radio Station. I was able to have some me time as well as do something productive that helps others.

I was soon asked to help run the desk for a Monday Morning Show which saw me doing the technical side of Radio and being an actual DJ. It is so nerve wrecking at first but after a few shows it becomes second nature. The next step was for me to have my very own show on a Tuesday Morning. This was my baby and something I was so happy about. In 2017 Showcase Tuesday was launched. I wanted to help new and existing musicians and acts show everyone what they are all about. I ask quite relaxed an informal questions to help us to get to know the people behind the talent.

I have had the pleasure to interview many people over the last few years and have been able to find friendships with a lot of them. My most nerve wrecking interview was with Giovanni Pernice a Dancer from Strictly Come Dancing back in 2017. He was so lovely and I was able to get such a great show from our chat.

Another community venture I have become involved with is a community Pastoral Support team headed up by Rev. Tim Laundon. This will involve members of the team visiting and supporting members of the public who would like someone to talk to due to being ill, lonely, housebound or even going through Cancer treatment. I myself am a cancer survivor and know first-hand how scary the whole process can be from diagnosis and treatment to given the all clear and constantly worrying about it returning. I would like to be there for others the way people were for me.

Being the wife of a soldier means you move around a lot and you can feel as though you don't belong in the community. I have never felt like that here in Tidworth. The local people are so kind and friendly and I feel have been very accepting and accommodating of my family. We love living in Tidworth and I love working within the community, I hope to be living here for a long while yet so I can continue to be part of such an amazing town, community and family. Community Services Committee Update

am Annie Nichols, the Tidworth Town Council's Services Administrator, and hopefully getting to grips with who does what where? As a mixed civilian and military town, including Perham Down, we can all work together to keep our hometown clean, and tidy, and exciting for visitors to come to. Please contact me if you have anything I can help you with.

The Community Services Committee meets on the second Tuesday of each month, to discuss the maintenance and management of the Community Centre and its' surrounding grounds. We also deal with general grounds maintenance across the town, five play parks, the Mortuary Chapel and the Civilian Cemetery. Although this Committee's profile is low key, the work it carries out is essential to the smooth running of the town.

Grounds Maintenance

The Services Committee meets with our grounds maintenance contractor Tivoli each Wednesday after the Services Committee meeting. This is an excellent forum to discuss issues raised by Council and/or Members of the Public, as well as the contract that is in place. The contract includes grass cutting and litter picking around our Tidworth Town Council areas. We have recently negotiated an increase in bin emptying in our five Play Parks to weekly over the school holidays. It is usually carried our fortnightly, but when the schools are closed the need to empty the bins increases. We are also installing another bin next to the youth shelter by the A338 Neighbourhood playpark, and this will also be emptied weekly.

The **Parish Steward** is employed by Wiltshire Council, and visits all Wiltshire parishes. He is rostered to visit Tidworth every two months for two days. He will call into the Community Centre to collect a list of tasks including gully clearing, drain clearing, minor repairs to signs,

verges, minor potholes in roads and footpaths, and clearance of weeds. He is a lovely man and very accommodating.

Wiltshire Council has recently introduced a new incentive for Town Councils, which enhances what the Parish Steward is already doing. They are called "The Sparkle **Team**". You may notice a group of workmen going around our town over a period of three or four days, cleaning signage, removing weeds, removing debris, collecting litter, and removing graffiti. The Sparkle Team visits our Town every other month, so if you notice any mulch or litter that needs removing, and it is on Wiltshire Council's land, please let me know.

All of these services are in place to maintain a welcoming environment for our Town's population, both in appearance and cleanliness. You can appreciate that this a very busy aspect of the Community Services Committee, but with your help in reporting issues, we can work together to achieve this very important aim. Everyone is most welcome to come and observe our meetings.

You can also report any issues on the "My Wiltshire" app, available on all Apple and Android devices, or via the Wiltshire Council website. Any issues involving highways, roadworks, lighting, litter, anti-social behaviour,



pollution, abandoned vehicles, grass cutting, right down to your "missing bin collection". You will be able to track your service request on line to its' conclusion.

many things myself and my colleagues do in order to help keep your community safe.

From things such as intelligence gathering, liaising with local organisations and businesses, dealing with low level crimes, public reassurance and neighbourhood disputes. A big part of this is showing a policing presence within the community.

I'm originally from County Durham but grew up in Tidworth due to family military connections so I feel like part of the community.

I've always wanted to join the police from a young age. After joining Wiltshire Police in Jan 2019, I applied to be a Police Community Support Officer with aspirations to becoming a Police Officer. I found this a positive way of gaining experience required.

I work out of Amesbury Police Station alongside a great team of Police Officers, other PCSO's and Local Crime Investigators (LCI's)
